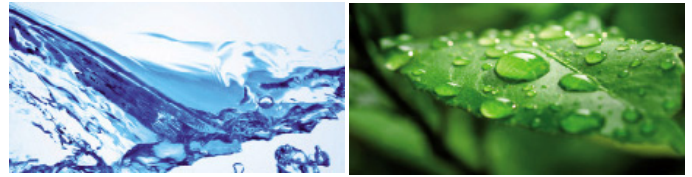

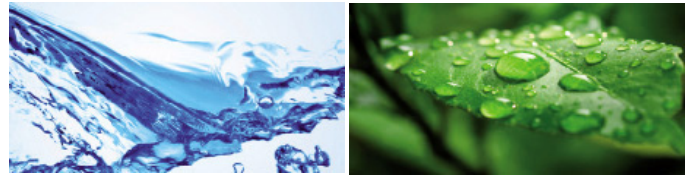

Provided expert testimony to US House of Representatives Committee on Financial Services on the development impacts of mining investment.

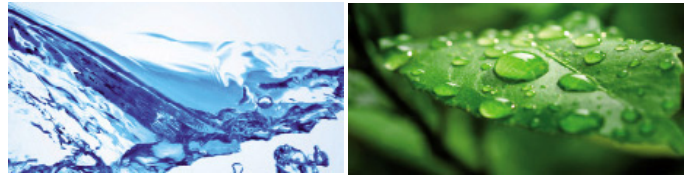
